There will be a Language Tutorial on **Gayo** (Gayo, Austronesian; Indonesia), given by **Domenyk Eades** (University of Salford) on 6th and 7th September.

The LAGB Education Committee will hold a two hour session devoted to the question 'Is a unified terminology possible for grammar?' including presentations from Professor John Payne and Professor Nigel Vincent (University of Manchester). VENUE

The conference will be held in the Lady Hale Building, situated on Peel Park Campus, at the University of Salford, Greater Manchester, M5 4WT. Papers will be given in the Lady Hale lecture theatre or one of the adjacent seminar rooms; refreshments and buffet-style lunch will also be served in the social space of the Lady Hale Building (pictured to the right). The **City of Salford** adjoins central Manchester and is famous as the home of the artist L. S. Lowry, the Imperial War Museum North, 16th Century Ordsall Hall and MediaCity UK at Salford Quays. Manchester itself is one of Britain's most dynamic cities, famous for its music culture, football teams, universities and exciting nightlife. The city boasts world-class galleries and museums, excellent shopping opportunities, and restaurants, pubs and bars to suit every taste.

REGISTRATION

The full package, including the conference fee and refreshments for four days and lunch on three days (Thurs, Fri, Sat) costs £150 for LAGB members and £175 for non-members. It is also possible to book for selected days at a cost of £45 per day for LAGB members and £50 per day for non-members. Accommodation, evening meals and the conference dinner (see below) are not included in this fee.

Registration for the full package by non-members includes **automatic LAGB membership** until January 2014 for waged delegates (15 months membership) and membership until January 2015 for unwaged delegates (27 months membership). Memberships will be activated during the LAGB meeting in September. Members will receive an e-mail notification to confirm that their membership has been activated. This offer is not available to non-members registering for single days rather than the whole conference.

Please note that the **early registration deadline is Sunday 19th August 2012** after which a surcharge will be added to the fee. For instance, the full conference fee after this date will be £175 for members and £195 for non-members. **Online registration closes on Friday 31st August 2012**. Refunds will not be possible after this date.

If you want to register for more than one item (e.g. the conference and the conference dinner or several individuals days) and want to avoid making two or more separate payments, please complete the various steps required for registering for the conference; when you get to the payment page, click *continue shopping* to add additional items.

Payment confirmation and attendance certification

Once you have registered for the conference and made your on-line payment, you will receive an automated e-mail confirming your registration and payment. Please note that this e-mail constitutes your receipt. No further copies will be issued later on. When you arrive at the conference, your registration pack will include a formal attendance confirmation (including the title of your presentation if appropriate).

ACCOMMODATION

Delegates are requested to make their own accommodation reservations. We suggest that delegates choose hotels that are close to Manchester Oxford Road or Manchester Piccadilly railway stations in order to reach the conference venue easily by train.

We have booked some affordable accommodation in a very central city centre location. **Weston Hall**, which forms part of **Manchester Conference Centre**, is a few minutes walk from Manchester Piccadilly and Manchester Oxford Road stations, and close to everything the city centre has to offer. This is the cheapest B&B accommodation available in the centre of Manchester: £35.00 per night. Train
